As you review the schedule, some of the highlights are the United States Fire Administration being at the Conference, Coach Dave Denniston begins his fourth season as the head coach of the Wyoming Swimming and Diving program. Prior to that, Denniston spent two seasons as an assistant coach with Wyoming. He came to UW after coaching the U.S. Paralympics swim team at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs since 2010. Andy Worshek served as Sonar Chief and Chief of the Boat for the USS Sante Fe with David Marquet. He is an expert in developing leaders and is prominently mentioned in David's award-winning book, Turn the Ship Around! For nearly a decade after serving with David on USS Sante Fe, Andy took the leader-leader approach to three more Navy commands and enjoyed the benefits of developing leaders.

As for the fun at the event, we will have a great welcoming at the Terry Bison Ranch which was first owned by F.E. Warren, the First Governor of Wyoming. He bought the 300,000 acre ranch from Charles H. Terry in 1881 and used it as his South headquarters for his Warren Livestock Company. Ron and Janice Thiel purchased 27,500 acres in 1991 and opened the company to the public in 1993. Ron originally intended it for the purpose of raising bison. Dan Thiel, the son of Ron and Janice, thought it would be a great idea to start a company that would allow people to be able to "get up close and personal" to the great North American Bison, now the Terry Bison Ranch. The private tour of the recently renovated Capital will also take place. The Wyoming Capitol Square project involves and centers around the restoration of the Wyoming State Capitol, which is a National Historic Landmark. The project has several components which may be executed in a sequenced/phased schedule:

- 1. Rehabilitation and Restoration of the Capitol
- 2. Rehabilitation and expansion of the Herschler Building
- **3.** Selective demolition and renovation of the below-grade gallery space that connects the Capitol and Herschler Building
- 4. Modifications to the drives and parking area below the Herschler Building
- 5. New Central Utility Plant (CUP)
- 6. Adjacent/ancillary site and system improvements

The Wyoming Capitol Square project has several important goals, among them are:

- 1. To address life-safety and building code issues
- 2. To invest in existing building needs and lessen the State's lease burden
- **3.** To be a host to the residents of Wyoming for their direct and meaningful participation in government, specifically regarding the creation of larger committee rooms for the public to participate more fully in legislative committee meetings
- 4. To improve safety and security for building occupants and visitors
- 5. To improve heating, cooling and ventilation systems and energy efficiency
- 6. To improve Capitol Complex parking and site amenities

The evening will conclude with the ability to tour historic down town and all of the great eats to include several special events at local establishments.

#### Tonya Hoover



#### Acting Fire Administrator U.S. Fire Administration

Tonya Hoover was named as the Acting U.S. Fire Administrator on January 20, 2021. Chief Hoover is also the Deputy Fire Administrator and the senior career federal fire official responsible for the day-to-day operations of the United States Fire

Administration including the programs and training activities at the National Emergency Training Center.

She also served as the superintendent of the National Fire Academy from May 2017 to January 2020 focused on promoting the professional development of the fire and emergency response community and its allied professionals; supplementing and supporting State and local fire service training programs, and developing and delivering various course unavailable at the State and local level.

Prior to her tenure at USFA, Chief Hoover served as the California State Fire Marshal where she was responsible for statewide fire prevention, fire service training, pipeline safety, code and regulations development, analysis, and implementation.

Chief Hoover received her MBA in Business and Human Resources from the University of Phoenix and a Bachelor of Science in Technical Education, specializing in Fire Protection and Safety, from Oklahoma State University. She holds an associate degree in Fire Protection Engineering Technology and possesses a California lifetime teaching credential for fire science.

She served on the board of directors for the National Fire Protection Association and the International Fire Service Training Association and continues to engage with the International Code Council.

Chief Hoover is an advocate for the women and men of the Nation's fire and emergency medical services.

Randy Downs has been with ISO since 2009. He started as a field representative in Iowa and eventually was promoted to manage the midwestern states. Currently he manages Minnesota, Iowa, Kansas,

# CONFERENCE SPEAKERS



#### **Dave Denniston**



Head Coach University of Wyoming Swimming & Diving

Dave Denniston begins his fourth season as the head coach of the Wyoming Swimming and Diving program. He was announced as the new head coach of the program on April 21, 2017. Prior to

that, Denniston spent two seasons as an assistant coach with Wyoming. He came to UW after coaching the U.S. Paralympics swim team at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs since 2010.

In 2005, Denniston was injured in a sledding accident and then went on to qualify for the 2008 Paralympic games. Denniston started a motivational speaking company called Mind Over Body. It was created to help people reach their goals despite barriers in life. He has also spent time as an Assistant Editor for Swimming World Magazine. He was awarded the NCAA Inspiration award in 2007, the Christopher and Dana Reeve Inspiration award in 2009 and James R. Flowers Coach of the Year award in 2012 while coach of the U.S. Paralympic team.

Denniston was a member of the Auburn University swim program from 1997-2002. A two-time team captain at Auburn, he was a three-time individual NCAA champion, including the 1999 national title in the 200-meter breaststroke. Denniston was a 15time All-American and also helped lead the Tigers to the 1999 NCAA Team Championship.

He competed in the 2000 Olympic Trials in the 100 and 200-meters, where he finished sixth and ninth, respectively. In 2003, he qualified for the World Championship Team in the 200-meter breaststroke before he primarily focused on qualifying for the 2004 U.S. Olympic Team. He finished fourth in the 100-meter breaststroke and fifth in the 200-meter breaststroke at the Olympic Trails.

Denniston is a 2002 graduate of Auburn where he earned a bachelor's degree in communications and a minor in English.

#### **James Rowan**



#### **Fire Leadership Coach**

James Rowan has been in the leadership, organizational development business for nearly 38 years. He started promoting celebrity speakers in college that ultimately lead to what he does today. He used to promote Ste-

phen Covey, Jim Rohn, Brian Tracy, Lou Holtz and about 34 other celebrity speakers.

He also has a Fire Service background. In High School he was the President of an EMT Explorer Post and spent six years working as a medic putting himself through college. After a summer as a Hot Shot, he was hired permanently by the Forest Service to do ALS/Tech Rescue.

Like most of us he was amazed at how 90% of his assessment to promote to Captain had to do only with on-scene issues which is about 15% of this job. In his opinion, 80% of this job is how to deal with difficult people on the floor, how to shut down negativity and how to build a strong combat team. Since retiring from the Fire Service 15 years ago, he's dedicated his life to giving back by helping Fire Chiefs solve their people problems, unite their command staffs and build greater morale on the floor. He's the Father of four daughters, reads at least two books per week and loves to travel the country by car visiting Fire Departments.

Fire Chief City of Lincoln (Neb.)

David Engler has over 27 years of experience in the fire service and is currently the Fire Chief for the City of Lincoln Fire & Rescue (NE). Chief Engler is currently in the Fire Service

Executive Development Institute (FSEDI) program and consults on fire, EMS, labor relations and human resource issues. Chief Engler is a licensed Paramedic and has been with Lincoln Fire & Rescue for 25 years.

### **Andy Worshek**



Chief of Staff City of Cheyenne

Andy Worshek imagines a workplace where everyone engages and contributes their full intellectual capacity, a place where people are healthier and happier because they have more control


over their work-a place where everyone is a leader.

Andy served in the Navy for 24 years, and achieved the rank of Master Chief. Assigned to the nuclear-powered submarine USS Santa Fe with Captain David Marquet – then ranked last in retention and operational standing – they teamed up and "turned that ship around" by developing a new model of leadership that built leaders at every level. Intent-Based Leadership took the Santa Fe from "worst to first," achieving the highest retention and operational standings in the Navy.

Stephen R. Covey rode the USS Santa Fe and said it was "the most empowering organization he'd ever seen" and wrote about the USS Santa Fe leadership practices in his book, The 8th Habit.

Andy is prominently featured in the bestselling leadership book, Turn the Ship Around! A True Story of Turning Followers Into Leaders, which tells the turnaround story of the USS Santa Fe. Fortune magazine named it the #1 must-read book to read, and USA Today put it on their list of the 12 best business books of all time. In addition, Andy co-authored The Turn the Ship Around! Workbook with David Marquet, listed as a top 10 best seller by the Washington Post.

Today, Andy is a globally recognized speaker and trainer with a unique perspective as one who served in both the follower and leader roles. His enthusiasm for implementing intent-based leadership from all levels, as well as teaching and training others, are his passion. When he is not sharing his experiences, Andy serves as the Chief of Staff for the City of Cheyenne.
