Terracon is pleased to submit the Draft Wyoming Cultural Properties Forms and Contributing List for the Capitol North Historic District Expansion for your review and comment. The survey forms present data from the June field survey of the Capitol North Historic District. The Terracon project team evaluated the results of the field survey and recommends a revised historic district expansion district boundary (*Attachment C, Exhibit 1*) and a total of 84 contributing resources, out of a total of 134 resources within the expanded district. Preliminary research indicates the period of significance will be expanded to include post-World War II and mid-century residential buildings that represent the final build-out of the neighborhood. The updated and expanded Capitol North Historic District will include a recommended 197 Contributing resources, representing 79% of all resources within the expanded district.

Terracon will address all comments from the City of Cheyenne and will then transmit the survey forms to the Wyoming State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) for their review and comment. Upon concurrence by the Wyoming SHPO with the recommendations for the Capitol North Historic District expansion, Terracon will proceed with the preparation of the updated National Register of Historic Places nomination for the historic district.
