



## GREENWAY ADVISORY COMMITTEE Meeting Minutes

**Call to Order:** Jim Walter, Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:05 pm. Since there was not a quorum at the time the chair proceeded with item 2 of the agenda.

### **Presentation by Victoria Ingerle, Child Injury Prevention Coordinator at CRMC:**

- Victoria discussed whether there was an opportunity or interest in allowing her to install temporary Story Walks along the Greenway. She showed the group examples. The group was generally positive about the project and Jeanie mentioned that she would need to work with the Parks Dept to determine appropriate areas to place these.
- Victoria also mentioned Safe Kids Day, which will be held on Saturday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> at the Library. The group would like to do a bike rodeo in the City parking lot on the same day.
- Both projects are part of an effort through Safe Routes Partnership, a collaborative effort that includes CRMC, LCSD #1, City of Cheyenne, Cheyenne MPO, FORMAK Foundation and Leadership Cheyenne.
- Pete Laybourn mentioned that safety is very important and asked about speeds on the Greenway. Jeanie said that the speed limit is 15 mph and is described on our maps and she does one or two press releases each year regarding Greenway safety and etiquette. Jim Walter asked if we had any ordinances related to the Greenway and Jeanie said she would look into it. She said she could look into placing speed limit signs on the Greenway.

Jo Butler joined the meeting at 12:15

### **Approval of Minutes**

- The committee approved January 13, 2026, meeting minutes unanimously.

### **Discussion and vote on member application**

- The committee approved Brent Toepfer to be a citizen member of the committee unanimously.

**Maintenance Update:**

- Via email, the city greenway crew is working on crack sealing, fill dirt along sidewalks, shop upkeep, built a bin for Kubota and John Deere doors, graffiti removal, fence repair, and helping Forestry water trees. Also, took all equipment to golf for maintenance before spring gets here.
- Via email, the county greenway crew reports business as usual.

**Engineering Projects that Effect or Include Greenway:**

- Via email Molly Cook reports that Wallick and Division is still in design and working through the most recent comments provided by stakeholders.
- Via email Bryce Sanchez reports that WYDOT lights should be on by next week for pedestain bridges over both I25 and I80.

**Greenway Projects Update – Jeanie****Kiwanis Park Wetlands and Trail Project**

- The project will be discussed at Finance Committee on Tues. Feb 17<sup>th</sup>. The project had 4 bidders responding. Aztec Construction was selected with a bid of \$487,560.00. Construction will begin after bird nesting season on July 15<sup>th</sup> and is expected to be complete by the end of 2026. Bird blinds and sign stands are being fabricated and will be installed once the general contractor completes foundations. Educational signage is complete and in my office.

**Parsley Blvd and I-80 Overpass Greenway Connector**

- This contract obtained final approval by Council last night. The project had 7 bidders responding. Miller and Sons were selected with a bid of \$228,870.80. Construction can begin at any time and should be completed by mid-May.

**Active Transportation Advisory Committee (ATAC) Update:**

- Charles Bloom provided an update on the Active Transportation Advisory Committee. They are working on a priority list and meet the third Monday of every month at 5:30 pm in the Human Resources Conference Room.

**Updates from the MPO:**

- Jennifer Corso reported that the West Crow Creek Greenway Plan is complete and was emailed to everyone this morning. They are working on the Safe Streets for All plan and discussed the details for this effort.

**Updates from LCSD#1:**

- Vicki reported on the efforts of the school district to work on the Safe Routes to School project through the Safe Routes Partnership.
- The district is working on design of both Arp Elementary and the new 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> school that will be located next to Afflerbach on Wallick Dr.

**Greenway Foundation Update:**

- Jeff Fasset reported that the Foundation needs volunteers and donations for Thankful Thursday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>. They are also working on a new website, planning for the annual Spring Into Green, 5k race on June 20<sup>th</sup> and potential fundraising with Leadership Cheyenne for art on the Greenway.

**Other items:**

- There were no other items to discuss.
