## **CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes**

### **Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)**

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

2019 was a productive year for the CDBG program. Through our four public service activities, over 3,394 people participated in activities aimed at improving self-sufficiency. The local food pantry assisted 3,218 low-income individuals with emergency food assistance and also assisted 163 low-income individuals with free bus passes. Climb Wyoming was able to assist 12 low-income single mothers with job training. Two separate training classes were scheduled; four single mothers attended CDL Training; eight single mothers attended Professional Business Careers Program Training. A scholarship for Laramie County Community College was also given to one low-income student.

Cheyenne Housing Authority Senior Service Center received rehatilitation assistance for their built in freezer. The Senior Center provides lunch for low-income seniors daily at five different locations and assisted approximately 787 seniors. This project was to provide for the upgrade of their condensing unit for their walk-in freezer.

Habitat for Humanity received funding for the acquisition of their new ReStore. The acquisition also included an ESA I and ESA II.

The City Community Recreation & Events (CRE) Department received funding for the replacement of the Lincoln Park Playground, located within a low-income area assisting approximately 1,120 residents. The old playground was worn and replacement parts were not available. The new playground is safe and ADA compliant.

Needs, Inc. received funding to rehabilitate their facility. A lead test was done. Unfortunately, there was a change in management and the anticipated rehabilitation work was not accomplished.

Program Administration was utilized to manage the CDBG grant funding for Fiscal Year 2019.

Two Fiscal Year 2018 projects were assisted with funding during the last year.

Habitat for Humanity received funding for their Home Rehabilitation Project. They received an extension to assist two more homeowners with rehabilitation. The first homeowner received assistance with grab bars and a ramp. The second homeowner received assistance for water erosion. Water was draining towards the house which was damaging their foundation. The remainder of the funding will be recaptured.

The Hand, Home Rehabilitation Project did not receive any applications during the last year, but three mortgages were released.

The City used CDBG funds to address Cheyenne's high priority needs including supportive services for low-income and special needs, neighborhood improvements, housing rehabilitation and improvements, job training and opportunities, program administration and Cheyenne's low priority needs; public facilities or infrastructure improvements. All 2019 CDBG activities align with the goals and objectives outlined in the 2015 Comprehensive Consolidated Plan. The City works very hard to use the funds as effectively and efficiently as possible.

### Narrative

In 2019, CDBG assisted 4,183 individuals/families. Of those assisted; approximately seventy-seven percent (3,243) identified themselves as White, seven percent (328) as African American, less than one percent (3) as Asian, three percent (106) as American Indian or American Native, twelve percent (503) as other/multi-race. Eighteen percent (759) identified as Hispanic.

Sixty-three (63) individuals/families were new to the service provided. One thousand six hundred thirteen (1,613) individuals were elderly. One thousand two hundred forty-two (1,242) individuals had a disability. Five hundred twenty-two individuals were female head-of-household.

Of the above households assisted; three thousand seven hundred forty-nine (3,749) individuals/families made less than 30% of the area median income, four hundred ten (410) individuals/families made between 30% and 50% of the area median income, twenty-three (23) individuals/families made between 50% and 80% of the area median income, and one (1) individual/family was above 80% of the area median income.

### Narrative

All of the funding was utilized within the City of Cheyenne.

Climb Wyoming's main office is located in Census Tract 7, Block 1 which is 65.75% low-moderate-income. Their clients are scattered throughout Cheyenne.

Needs, Inc.'s main office is located in Census Tract 2, Block 2 which is 62.05% low-moderate-income. Their clients are scattered throughout Cheyenne.

H&CD Advisory Council Scholarship Program's main office is located in Census Tract 7, Block 1 which is 65.75% low-moderate-income. The applicant resides in Census Tract 15.01, Block 3 which is 42.96% low-moderate-income.

COMEIA, Inc.'s main office is located in Census Tract 7, Block 1 which is 65.75% low-moderate-income. Per HUD homeless individuals are all considered low-income.

Laramie County Senior Services Program's main office is located in Census Tract 7, Block 1 which is 65.75% low-moderate-income. The seniors are scattered throughout Cheyenne.

Community Parks & Recreation, Lincoln Park is located in Census Tract 2, Block 2 which is 62.05% low-moderate-income.

Habitat for Humanity's main office is located in Census Tract 7, Block 1 which is 65.75% low-moderate-

income. Their new ReStore is located in Census Tract 7, Block 3 which is 34.66% low-moderate-income.

Program Administration's main office is located in Census Tract 7, Block 1 which is 65.75% low-moderate-income.

## **Leveraging**

**Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.**

Cheyenne's CDBG allocation complements a number of other federal resources, as well as, state and local resources.

The Community Parks & Recreation Department leveraged the \$193,201 of CDBG funding with in-kind assistance for the Lincoln Park Playground by removing the old playground. They also received \$4,000 from the noon Rotary Club of Cheyenne.

Needs, Inc. leveraged the \$25,000 of CDBG funding for Food Assistance. Additional funds received were from: United Way - FEMA \$8,657, private donations \$5,740 and corporate donations \$15,987.

Cheyenne Climb program leveraged the \$15,000 of CDBG funding for CDL and Professional Business Career training classes. Additional funds received were from: Cheyenne Women's Civic League \$1,000, Empowering Single Mothers \$12,076.61, Families Becoming Independent \$4,016, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program \$1,830 and Cheyenne Unrestricted Donations \$29,175.45.

Laramie County Senior Services Program leveraged the \$15,832.75 of CDBG funding for the upgrade of their condensing unit for their walk-in freezer. Additional funds received were from in-kind (\$837.96) which consisted of writing the specs for the upgrade, soliciting bids, supervising the project and processing the payment requests to include Davis Bacon.

**Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.**

In Fiscal Year 2019 no applications were received for the Affordable Housing goal.

Habitat for Humanity (HFH) had received funding in Fiscal Year 2018 to assist 10 low-income households with housing rehabilitation. They requested an extension and were able to assist two low-income households in Fiscal Year 2019.

HFH received another application for housing rehabilitation. An elderly couple needed a new roof. Unfortunately, they were unable to assist this couple due to lack of contractor availability. HFH was informed that the roofers were all one-year out for accepting jobs.

**Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.**

Housing rehabilitation will continue to be a priority for Cheyenne. Maintaining the current housing stock is essential. Unfortunately, finding contractors who are in sam.gov is difficult. Habitat for Humanity has become a general contractor and has offered to assist local contractors in registering for sam.gov.

In Fiscal Year 2020 HFH has received funding to purchase a home, rehabilitate the home and put it back on the market for a low-income family.

## **CR-25 - Homeless and Other Special Needs 91.220(d, e); 91.320(d, e); 91.520(c)**

**Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:**

### **Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs**

The City of Cheyenne is a member agency of the Wyoming Homeless Collaborative (WHC). The WHC is the State of Wyoming's Continuum of Care (COC) for homeless services. The WHC membership consists of service providers, shelter directors, state government administrators, Veterans Administration employees, and advocates for the homeless. WHC administers the COC Grant and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) for the State of Wyoming. WHC is also responsible for the annual Homeless Point-In-Time Count. During last years membership meeting Dr. Marbut presented his findings on a state-wide homeless survey. This years membership meeting was cancelled due to COVID-19.

The City of Cheyenne directs resources to strategies that help to address the homeless. During FY 2019 Needs, Inc. received funding for emergency food assistance and bus assistance. Both of these programs are available to the homeless.

There are several agencies in Cheyenne that provide meals for the homeless. The Salvation Army provides lunch, and COMEA provides dinner. Wyoming Coalition for the Homeless operates a day center where the homeless can spend the day and do their laundry.

Several agencies provide clothing and personal items. Cheyenne Healthcare for the Homeless Clinic provides free medical services.

### **Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons**

COMEA is the emergency shelter for men and women. The emergency dorm offers up to 5-days stay and provides the basic services. New residents meet with a case manager where they learn about the Journey Program. The Journey Program has three groups that depend on the time a person has spent in the program. The Pre-Journey Program is open to men and women who need special assistance in preparing to enter the work force. The Journey 1 program is available to anyone staying at the shelter who has shown a strong desire to escape homelessness. Journey 2 is for those who have found a job and are working towards becoming independent. The Pay-to-Stay Program is designed to be the next step for those who complete the Journey Program by maintaining employment and meeting their goals. The residents pay for a semi-private living cubicle. The Transitional Living Program (TLP) serves those with circumstances that make independent living exceptionally difficult, including people struggling with mental/physical disabilities, substance abuse, those recently released from prison, and any others who struggle with self-sufficiency. TLP Residents pay a percentage of their monthly income to rent a studio apartment. Covid-19 has affected COMEA's services but they are working to secure

their building to make it safer for all of their clients.

Family Promise of Cheyenne assists homeless families with minor children. Family Promise is the sole family only shelter in Laramie County and partners with the local faith communities to provide shelter. During COVID-19 the families are unable to stay at the different church's. They are being placed in hotel rooms instead.

Community Action of Laramie County (CALC) offers transitiional housing. Their program consists of single-occupancy apartments that are offerd to homeless individuals, as well as, larger apartments and/or homes to assist low-income families. CALC also has a VA Bridge Housing Program which offers temporary housing to low-income veterans.

Unaccompanied Student Initiative (USI) has one house and a twin-home for homeless students attending high-school.

**Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs**

Several agencies provide homeless prevention programs that assist with rent and utilities; COMEA and The Salvation Army are two of the agencies.

COVID-19 has expanded the homeless prevention assistance in Cheyenne. The United Way and Wyoming Community Development Authority were able to assist with rent and utilities through donations.

**Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again**

The Unaccompanied Student Initiative (USI) started as an action team for Laramie County Community Partnership. USI provides safe, stable housing in the form of a house and a twin-home for unaccompanied youth, ages 16-20. They have developed a support system for high-school students experiencing homelessness while they finish school.



Family Promise provides assistance to homeless families. They provide counseling services for their families to assist them in becoming self-sufficient.

The Cheyenne Housing Authority manages the HUD-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) program which consists of 1,938 Housing Choice Vouchers.

## **CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)**

### **Actions taken to address the needs of public housing**

The need for public housing is consistent; Cheyenne Housing Authority (CHA) currently has 1,280 households on its waiting list for 341 public housing units. CHA maximizes the use of those 341 units by preparing a vacated unit for occupancy and leasing that unit to a new tenant in an average of 20 days, by effectively maintaining the units through prompt response to resident calls for maintenance services and prioritized expenditure of Capital Funds, ensures resident health and safety by enforcing the lease including HUD's smoke-free requirement. To help address the demand for affordable housing (including public housing), among other activities CHA sponsored nonprofit Wyoming Housing Partnership – which owns and manages 108 units of affordable housing.

### **Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership**

The best method CHA has found to encourage public housing residents' involvement in management is to engage them in the creation and maintenance of a Resident Council. At each of its multifamily public housing properties, CHA encourages and participates in monthly Resident Council meetings. The Councils, through minutes and direct communication to staff, provide CHA with resident's perspective on CHA public housing policies and property management issues.

Participation in home ownership is a greater challenge, as most public housing residents are not income-qualified for home ownership. Homeownership inquiries are directed to CHA's Welcome Home Wyoming program and related information on CHA's website, to the Wyoming Community Development Authority, local lenders, and others that can encourage the pursuit of homeownership opportunities.

### **Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs**

The Cheyenne Housing Authority is not a troubled PHA.

## **CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)**

**Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)**

Plan Cheyenne is in the process of being updated and meetings are being held. The next phase of Plan Cheyenne is Connect 2045, Cheyenne area's new Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) for all modes of travel, including car, bike, pedestrian, transit, and freight.

Wyoming was holding Housing Tool Kit meetings. COVID-19 disrupted these meetings and they are just starting up again. Two year's ago several next steps were identified. The first priority was to establish clear goals. A sub-group worked together to flesh out next steps for moving forward a State Housing Trust Fund. Another sub-group worked together on the concept of preserving and building new affordable rental housing and possible new construction by grouping multiple small scattered sites into a single Low-Income Housing Tax Credit/Private Activity Bond financing. Last year a strategic plan and an action plan was developed. A contract was signed with Community Builders, and a partnership was formed with Lander and Lovell to produce a Zoning Best Practices and a DIY Guide to Auditing Zoning Codes.

The Housing and Community Development Office, in conjunction with the Cheyenne Housing Authority and Wyoming Business Council hosted Davis Bacon Training. All Fiscal Year 2019 General Service CDBG Sub-grantees were invited to this training and encouraged to attend.

## **Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

Despite efforts, there continues to be underserved needs and obstacles in our community. There are many causes for this including COVID-19, uncertain economic times and budget cuts. Obstacles involve the high rise in the cost of goods and materials, the diminishing availability of affordable housing, the scarcity of jobs that pay a living wage, high rents, unemployment, and more people requiring assistance. Cheyenne addresses these obstacles by supporting programs like the HAND Rehabilitation program that provides housing improvements for low-income and special needs individuals; Needs, Inc. provides food, bus passes, clothing, and household items free for low-income individuals; The Salvation Army provides homeless prevention assistance; several agencies provide self-sufficiency tools to help families and individuals recover from economic, medical and other setbacks; Dads Make a Difference and Climb Wyoming provide job training; My Back Door works with low-income families to help them prepare for homeownership.

The second half of Fiscal Year 2019 was especially difficult due to COVID-19. Unemployment rose drastically, supplies quickly dwindled, and stores closed. The fallout will affect everyone for years to come. The United Way stepped up to provide rent and utility assistance and churches stepped up to

assist with food.

### **Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

Cheyenne continues to evaluate lead hazards and continues building lead mitigation and reduction efforts into existing housing programs, such as housing rehabilitation. Cheyenne also continues to provide lead testing for non-profit agencies that perform housing rehabilitation. Lead testing is also done if a non-profit acquires a building.

The H&CD Office Contract Housing Inspector is trained in dealing with lead-based paint and is certified as a lead paint Inspector and Risk Assessor. Only Certified Renovation Firms, listed with the EPA, are invited to bid on the homes where lead-based paint is found.

Lead paint information booklets are available in English and Spanish, and are provided to all HAND and HOME Program participants, as well as, buyers through the Cheyenne Homebuyers Opportunities Program (CHOP). Sub-grantees who perform housing rehabilitation are also provided copies to give to their homeowners.

### **Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The City of Cheyenne continues to implement strategies to reduce the number of families and individuals living in poverty. Focus is primarily on supporting programs that raise household incomes and stabilize family situations. Actions include providing rehabilitation to low-income housing and supportive service programs.

The City works closely with non-profit agencies to maximize the impact of targeted programs on poverty. The targeted programs include transportation, food, and job training.

### **Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The City of Cheyenne Housing and Community Development (H&CD) office manages the Community Development Block Grant Funding. The Program Manager works with the Laramie County Community Partnership (LCCP) which consists of nearly 65 partners, comprised of human service organizations, private-sector individuals, faith-based groups, funders and local and state government representatives. The H&CD Office is also a member of WyoNAHRO and Wyoming Homeless Collaborative.

During FY 2019 the Program Manager attended meetings with LCCP and the Housing Action Team, as well as, one WHC meeting. Meetings were also held with city staff.

Due to COVID-19 most of the Wyoming Homeless Collaborative, Housing ToolKit Committee, and WyoNAHRO meetings and conferences were cancelled.

**Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

Cooperation with non-profit agencies serving Cheyenne's residents is necessary to meet the housing and supportive needs of the community. Cheyenne supports applications for funding by various agencies when funds will be used for programs that address community needs and meet the identified goals and objectives listed in the Comprehensive Consolidated Plan.

The Cheyenne staff serves on various non-profit boards and committees, thereby strengthening communication and coordination of services. Cheyenne will continue to foster these relationships and seek ways to expand partnerships in the coming years.

The local non-profits are working on a shared database that will allow all affiliated agencies to access client data. This will allow clients the ability to provide their personal information to one agency instead of providing it to all agencies they are receiving assistance from. This will also allow the agencies to know where the clients have received assistance and where additional assistance could be obtained.

**Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)**

The City of Cheyenne is committed to affirmatively furthering fair housing within the community. The CDBG program provides a fair housing platform by supporting organizations and programs that promote accessible housing and infrastructure for people with disabilities, affordable housing through rehabilitation, down-payment assistance, and self-sufficiency programs. These programs assist residents with basic needs, provide resources to access services and housing and obtain knowledge.

The H&CD Office worked with the state on an AFH Collaboration Agreement and the City of Cheyenne updated their Analysis of Impediments utilizing some of the information obtained from the AFH Collaboration Agreement.

Attached is a copy of the AI along with the survey that was distributed during the Analysis of Impediments process.

Identified impediments were:

1. Lack of a local fair housing office.
2. Lack of understanding what fair housing means.
3. Limited supply of affordable housing.
4. Other impediments include lack of education and job skills, lack of credit history, lack of transportation, etc.

Cheyenne's CDBG Program Manager regularly monitors all CDBG projects and sub-grantees for regulatory compliance. Formal monitoring of projects occurs annually along with periodic site monitoring and visits. Formal monitoring includes review of all projects, labor standards monitoring, and verifying national objective compliance.

## Fiscal Year 2019 Annual Report

The Housing & Community Development (H&CD) Office accepted applications for their Fiscal Year 2019 Community Development Block Grant funding cycle in October 2018.

Five Public Service applications were received totaling \$110,000. There was \$65,000 available for Public Service. Five General Service applications were received totaling \$367,094.44. There was \$293,172 available for General Service plus \$73,923 of recaptured funding.

The H&CD Advisory Council met with the applicants in February 2019 to discuss the individual applications. Four Public Service and five General Service applications were approved.

## Public Service Accomplishments

Within Fiscal Year 2019 funding was provided for the below activities:

**LCCC Scholarships** received a total of \$5,000 for a Tuition Assistance Program. One low-income student applied and meet the requirements of the application.

**Needs, Inc.** received a total of \$25,000 for their Crisis Food Assistance Program. A total of 3,218 low-income individuals received crisis food assistance. Needs received an **additional \$30,384.00** from the community and other donors to help with this program.

**Needs, Inc.** also received a total of \$20,000 for their Bus Token Assistance Program. A total of 163 low-income individuals received bus token assistance.

**Climb Wyoming** received a total of \$15,000 for their Job Training Program. A total of 12 low-income single mothers received \$15,000. Two separate training classes were scheduled: four mothers attended CDL training, eight mothers attended Professional Business Career training. Climb received an additional \$44,082.06 from the community and other donors to help with this program.

## Fiscal Year 2020

The U. S. Department of Housing & Urban Development approved the City of Cheyenne Fiscal Year 2020 Community Development Block Grant request.

The following projects were approved.

COMEA received \$16,000 to provide Identification Replacement for approximately 100 homeless and Transportation Assistance for approximately 200 homeless individuals.

Needs, Inc. received \$45,000 to provide food box assistance to approximately 2,000 low-income individuals and will also provide free bus tokens to approximately 300 low-income individuals.

The LCCC Scholarship program received \$4,000 to provide for scholarship assistance at Laramie County Community College for approximately four low-income students.

Cheyenne Ice and Events Center received \$15,500 to provide for the removal of architectural barriers. This area benefit will provide for the replacement and installation of ADA Handicapped Accessible doors for the entrance, ADA accessible doors to the ice rink and the snack bars and condiment bars will be brought up to ADA code. This will benefit approximately 2,000 individuals.

The CRE Department received \$220,000 to provide for the replacement of an old and worn playground at Pioneer Park. This area benefit will help approximately 3,270 individuals.

The CHA Senior Center received \$33,500 to provide for money saving improvements to their facility. The improvements consist of the replacement of exterior windows and indoor and outdoor LED cost efficient lighting. This will assist approximately 925 low-income seniors.

Habitat for Humanity received \$98,250 to provide for the acquisition and rehabilitation of a residential home. This will benefit one low-income family.

Family Promise received \$237,267 for the acquisition of a facility to be used as a family shelter and an envision center. This will assist approximately 500 low-income individuals.

## CDBG-CV 2020

On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The CARES Act made \$465,904 available to the City of Cheyenne under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV). These funds are to be used to prevent, prepare for and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). It is proposed that the following projects be funded.
