What is a Landfill?

Some may still call it “the dump,” but the City of Cheyenne Landfill is a strictly regulated engineering project aimed at the protection of human health and the environment. A modern landfill has a lengthy permitting process vetted by state and federal agencies, with requirements for initial siting, size, design, construction, monitoring, and final closure. A landfill is designed to encapsulate waste within a bottom layer and a final cover. The bottom layer prevents landfill liquids (leachate) from contaminating groundwater. The final cover prevents direct exposure to waste and rainwater from infiltrating into the landfill. Both layers are also designed to prevent unwanted gas migrations. Because filling a landfill

may take several decades, the final cover is installed once the waste reaches final design elevation. In the meantime, waste is covered daily with soil, mulch, spray-on materials, and tarps. Leachate is collected at the bottom of the landfill through a system of pumps and pipes and sent to a lined evaporation pond. The lifespan of a landfill is measured in “airspace” which is the design volume of trash allowed to fit between the liner and final cover. The main factors that help with preserving airspace are waste compaction, efficient daily cover materials, and diversion programs (i.e., recycling, where the local community plays a central role) The City of Cheyenne landfill is open to the public Monday – Friday 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Please see our fee schedule or call (307) 632-8315.
